District & Community

The Green Bay Area Public School District is a unified school district of 92 square miles that covers the city of Green Bay and surrounding areas. More than 21,300 students attend 24 elementary schools (K-5), one K-8 school, two specialty schools (K-8 and K-5), four middle schools, (6-8) and four high schools (9-12), making it the fifth largest school district in the state of Wisconsin.

Located in Brown County in Northeastern Wisconsin, Green Bay is the home to several Fortune 500 companies and the Green Bay Packers NFL team. Green Bay is the third largest city in the state of Wisconsin with a population of over 104,000. The area is also home to several institutions of higher education.

East High School

East High School provides quality educational and co-curricular programs for a diverse student population. Strong music and drama programs provide opportunities for participation in a variety of performance groups, plays, and musicals. The East High School faculty and students take pride in creating a warm and caring learning atmosphere that encourages the pursuit of excellence. East operates a traditional eight (8) period schedule.

Graduation Requirements

A minimum of 22 credits in grades nine through twelve are required for graduation. These units must include: Language Arts (4), Social Studies (3), Mathematics (3), Science (2), Physical Education (1.5), Health (.5), Personal Financial Management (.5), Electives (7.5), and Service Learning (24 hours).

High School Credit

High school credit maybe awarded to middle school students enrolled in equivalent high school courses at the middle school and for courses taken at the high school while enrolled in grades 6-8. Students may earn these credits in the areas of mathematics, health, and foreign language.

Class Rank

Class rank, which is a non-weighted rank, is computed by averaging grades for all subjects. Failing grades are also computed in this average. Students who achieve a minimum scholastic average of 3.0-3.49 for seven semesters become eligible for the designation of honor students, and an average of 3.5-4.0 for the designation of high honor students. Students have the option to include physical education in their GPA.

Youth Options

Juniors and seniors have the opportunity to attend a technical college, a University of Wisconsin system school, or a private, nonprofit college to pursue high school and/or post-secondary credits through the Wisconsin Youth Options Program.
